School Lunches

My thanks to all of you who took the time to make your thoughts on the Health School Lunches scheme known to those in positions of influence. Over 47,000 signed the petition to save free school lunches and thanks to that support the government has not made the cuts to the programme that they campaigned on.

It has been confirmed this week that there will be no changes to the provision of lunches for children in Year 1-6, through to the end of 2026. However, there will be significant changes to the way lunches are provided to students in Years 7 and above, which will see children in our school - and in some cases siblings within a family - being treated differently. Once we know more about exactly what this will look like I will share the details with you.

Rāwhiti School is joining the movement on Pink Shirt Day (Friday 17 May 2024), and encouraging our staff and students to Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu, Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora – Speak up, Stand Together, Stop Bullying!

Pink Shirt Day works to reduce bullying by celebrating diversity in all its forms and supporting schools, workplaces and communities to be safe, supportive, welcoming and inclusive for everyone.

To celebrate this important kaupapa we'll be having a non-uniform day, with a gold coin donation.

This term, we have a group of students from the University of Canterbury who are studying a Bachelor of Sport in our school. As part of their degree, they are required to go into schools and teach children skills through a variety of different activities over the course of 5 weeks. This course looks into the Play-Teach-Play Model which emphasises the idea of getting kids active through recreational activities by allowing them time to play without instruction, breaking down individual skills in a game and then playing once again.

One group will be coming into school on a Tuesday lunchtime to run mini-tournaments with senior students, and another group will be taking the junior students for some structured PE lessons.

Tuning in to Kids + Tuning Into Teens

A six-session programme for parents/caregivers of children aged 5-12 years Tuning Into TEENS is an option for parents/caregivers of tamariki in school years 6-8 (10-13yrs)

TIK and TINT are evidence-based programmes designed to teach parents & caregivers:

- Awareness and regulation of their own and their children's emotions To use children's emotional

- To use children's emotional experiences as an opportunity for closeness and teaching Skills in assisting children to verbally label and manage their emotions Skills in assisting children to problem solve, and guide children's behaviour with appropriate limits

Sessions include:

- Watching video material
- · Group discussions and exercises
- · Role plays
- · Home activities to practice different ways of responding to your child's emotions
- · Participants sharing their own experiences within the group
