• We are once again surveying our school community (whānau, students and staff) to ask about the direction of learning that we (as a community) believe will best support the children at Rāwhiti School. This will inform ongoing strategic planning for the Board of Trustees as the school enters its second decade in 2025. The survey will be asking about our school vision of 'Rising Above the Ordinary' to find out what being more than ordinary means for you, about the skills, qualities and values that you think your child will need in order to thrive in their future. We are also keen to hear about your aspirations for Rāwhiti School. If you have more than one child at school, you will only need to complete the survey once. Our Learning around our concept of Action shifts this term to the Social Sciences curriculum. Our junior studios will be looking at who are the people in our community that help us and how we can take Action to help ourselves. The Y4-8 studios will be exploring how people have taken action, how people have stood up to injustice and how they can take action. The whole school will also be completing the Keeping Ourselves Safe programme. There are also trips, sport activities and noho marae.
