

The structure of our learning teams across the school supports the new curriculum refresh in Mathematics and Literacy being rolled out by the government next year. From 2025 onwards you will start to hear about 'Phases of Learning'. The Phases of Learning give clear outcomes for learning and teaching that are underpinned by the science of learning, explicit teaching practice, structured literacy approaches, and positive relationships in learning. The phases for all primary and intermediate schools across New Zealand are defined as; Year NE-Year 3 (Phase 1), Years 4-6 (Phase 2) and Years 7 - 8 (Phase 3).
